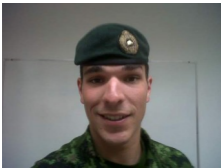

A proud Canadian of Métis, Cree and European ancestry, Lendsay earned his Bachelor of Science in Kinesiology and Physiology Minor in 1981 and attained his M.B.A. in 1993 from the University of Saskatchewan. Tom St. Onge joined the Canadian Forces in 2001, graduated from RMC with a B.Eng. in Electrical Engineering in 2005. He then completed post-graduate studies at RMC, graduating in '07 with a MAsc in Electrical Engineering, with a focus on power distribution. In 2008, Tom completed his initial training as a Combat Engineer and was posted to 4 Engineer Support Regiment in Gagetown, NB. In 2006, Mark implemented the City's then recently completed Community Energy Plan. Under the guidance of the CEP, the City has passed aggressive energy efficiency standards, installed four wood pellet boilers and completed a number of building retrofits, including an ice plant heat recovery system that will supply heat to the Multiplex and new Fieldhouse. In addition, the City is building on the Mine Energy feasibility study and is in the process of developing an investment grade business case for the proposed district heating system.
