Bylaw 4: Each member in-good-standing is entitled to vote for as many candidates as there are vacancies to be filled, or for a lesser number.

The following Council Positions will change in March:

President; Justin Hazenberg, P.Eng. Acclaimed as President for 2020-2022 (after the AGM on March 11, 2020)

1st Vice President (two-year term);

2nd Vice President (one-year term);

Two Councillors (three-year terms);

One Councillor (two-year term);

One Public (Lay) Member (three-year term).

Lay Members are appointed by Department of Justice. All other Council Members are elected.



Justin Hazenberg, P.Eng. is a home-grown northern engineer with a background in both the private and public sector. Hailing from the community of Fort Simpson, NWT, Justin spent nine years as a consulting engineer on projects across the NWT and Nunavut, including mine site remediation, environmental site assessments and remediation, fuel storage facilities, water intakes, water treatment, wastewater treatment, and shallow-buried arctic piped water and sewer systems.

In 2013, Justin began the next phase of his career as Engineering Team Lead, Water and Sanitation with the Government of the Northwest Territories (GNWT) Department of Municipal and Community Affairs. Justin manages the circuit rider program that provides on-site training and support to NWT operators, chairs the inter-departmental technical committee on drinking water and wastewater, and is the lead technical reviewer for all drinking water projects in the Northwest Territories.

Justin is a long-time volunteer of NAPEG and is the current 1st Vice President of the association. He has previously served as President of both the Consulting Engineers of the Northwest Territories (now ACEC-NT) and the Northern Territories Water and Waste Association. Justin is passionate for knowledge development; he regularly participates in code and guideline development and is the former chair of the NAPEG Professional Development Committee.

Currently, Justin is working to complete his MBA. In his spare time, he enjoys spending time with his wife and two young daughters in the great outdoors.

Reinstatement Policy Check Website for Full Policy

A request for reinstatement must be accompanied by a completed and signed application form, current resume, government issued identification, and the application fee, if circumstance require payment of the application fee (as below).

Staff will confirm standing of the applicant in other Canadian jurisdictions based on where the applicant is/has been licensed to practice. The applicant identifies other jurisdictions on the application form.

The application fee will be waived if the registrant resigned from NAPEG in good standing within the previous two years (24 months). If it has been more than two years, the applicant must include the application fee with the request outlined above.

Kamran Ata, P.Eng.

Kamran Ata, P.Eng. completed his bachelors in Civil Engineering in 1990 from the Military College of Engineering, Pakistan. His eighteen years' career with Corps of Engineers, Pakistan encompasses a variety of civil and combat engineering construction projects; engineering strategic planning at Engineer-in-Chief branch; service with multi-national task force at Kuwait and Afghanistan for land reclamation projects; engineering intelligence data collection and analysis with Information Management Cell; and a prized position of teaching under-grad students at the Military College of Engineering.

NAPEG Mission

In the public interest, NAPEG regulates and supports the professional practice of engineering and geoscience in the Northwest Territories and Nunavut.

NOTE:

2020 Annual Renewal is required under bylaw on, or before, January 1 each year.

The current Act allows for 90 days of forgiveness which to date has been determined to be March 31. This may change now that renewal opens on November 1 each year.

Any renewal not completed within deadlines, including payment of fees, the individual or firm may have their license to practice in the NT/NU removed upon approval of Council and direction to the Executive Director.

A late fee of \$45 is applied to all overdue accounts after 60 days. For Annual License Fees, this means after the last day of February.

All Annual Renewals are to be completed on-line from the account on the NAPEG Website. NAPEG Staff are available to assist if you have trouble with this on-line process. Phone the NAPEG office at 867-920-4055.
