## NAPEG Renewal 2021 and Reporting CPD

While we are uncertain during the pandemic about what the winter may bring, we anticipate that many of you will continue to practice in 2021. We will be opening renewal on November 1.

Please contact the NAPEG Office if you have any problems accessing your online account. After answering the required questions, you will be able to download an invoice for your employer or immediately pay by credit card and print your receipt.

If you need to resign, please do so online or send us an email. We are hopeful that reporting your hours for continuing professional development will be seamless. You are required to submit 240 professional development hours (PDH) over three (3) years. There are lots of online courses and presentations.

The following outlines some of the categories for reporting of professional development hours. Check the full program on the website for more details.

Category	Hours	Maximum PDH
Professional Practice	15 hours = 1 PDH	50
Formal Activity	1 hour = 1 PDH 1 CEU = 10 PDH	30
Informal Activity	2 hours = 1 PDH	30
Participation	1 hour = 1 PDH	20 or 10 non- professional
Presentation	1 hour = 4 PDH Can only use the same presentation once	20
Contributions to Knowledge	Varies	30

Note: If you report to another Canadian jurisdiction where CPD is mandatory, just tell us as part of renewal, and you do not need to fill out the form.

## Consultation on Amendments to the Wastewater Systems Effluent Regulations

Environment and Climate Change Canada (ECCC) is looking for your comments on proposed amendments to the *Wastewater Systems Effluent Regulations* with a focus on two specific areas:

**Transitional Authorizations:** ECCC is proposing to allow eligible communities another opportunity to receive an extension (transitional authorization) to comply with the Regulations. The rules for qualifying for this extension, and the deadline to upgrade or build a new wastewater treatment facility would remain the same.

**Expansion of existing temporary bypass authorization:** ECCC is also proposing to expand the existing temporary bypass authorizations in the Regulations to include planned releases of wastewater from sewer systems. This approach is being considered to improve transparency and result in the least possible impact on the environment. The amended regulations would allow eligible communities to apply for a temporary bypass authorization for short term releases.

Open for comments from June 27, 2020 to March 31, 2021.

#### NOTE:

2021 Annual Dues Renewal will open on November 1, 2020.

(Bylaw 18. (a) sets payment to be received on, or before, January 1).

The current Act and Bylaws allow for 90 days of forgiveness which has been recognized as March 31.

Any renewal not completed within deadlines, including payment of fees, the individual or firm may have their license to practice in the NT/NU removed upon approval of Council and direction to the Executive Director.

A late fee of \$45 is applied to all overdue accounts after 60 days. For Annual License Fees, this means after the last day of February.

All Annual Renewals are to be completed on-line from the account on the NAPEG Website.

# Finnigan Northern Award for Student Research Presentations

Dr. Craig Finnigan was a Professional Geoscientist who spent the majority of his short career working across the Canadian north for industry, government and academia.

Craig passed away in 2014 at the age of 45: however his passion for geoscientific field work and exploration has left an imprint on those who worked with him over the years. He thrived on the North's diverse opportunities and he contributed to our understanding of the geology in a number of places, including the metallogeny of gold in the Kivalliq District of Nunavut, the Yellowknife Greenstone Belt in Northwest Territories and the Dawson Range, Yukon.

He completed his M.Sc. degree on the gold mineralization in the Yellowknife belt in 2000, and was recognized by AMEBC in 2014 with the prestigious Huestis Award for his role in the discovery of the Coffee gold deposits in the Yukon.

Craig was an adamant supporter of students and education and as Adjunct Professor at Western University he co-supervised a number of graduate student theses, including

studies on the Coffee gold deposits in Yukon and uranium mineralization at the Lac Cinquante uranium deposit in Nunavut. As such, a student focused scholarship encourages presentations at northern conferences is a fitting and appropriate way to honour Craig's memory.

Individuals or organizations wishing to contribute to the Finnigan Northern Award for Student Research Presentations fund may make a donation to the Northwest Territories and Nunavut Association of Professional Engineers and Geoscientists (NAPEG) Education Foundation.

#### **Objectives of the Award**

NAPEG encourages the achievement of excellence in the engineering and geosciences professions through the promotion of advanced studies and research programs. By providing financial assistance to researchers working in the northern territories, the Foundation seeks to encourage young geoscientists to communicate effectively to their peers and the public, an important skill in the development of a professional practitioner.

#### **Eligibility**

To be eligible, the applicant must be enrolled in a Canadian university and registered in a Geology or Earth Sciences program that includes a thesis with a subject relevant to the territory in which the results would be presented.

The applicant must also have submitted an abstract (or similar document) for a talk or poster presentation at the conference indicated on their application form. <u>Award winners in 2020 will present in 2021</u>. The applicant must attend this conference and give the presentation in order to receive scholarship funding. An individual can be awarded the scholarship more than once; however, priority will be given to applicants who have not received the scholarship previously.

The recipients of the Finnigan Northern Award in 2019 were:


Nunavut: **Erin Bros** (Alberta) -Research related to understanding of the Mary River Group, and of the formation of granite-greenstone belts worldwide.

Northwest Territories: **Shelby Austin-Fafard** (University of Saskatchewan) - "Volcanic Setting of the South Sunset Rhyolite, Beaulieu Volcanic Belt, Slave Province"

Yukon: **Nicola Denisova** (Memorial University) - "Stratigraphy, hydrothermal and tectonomagmatic environment of the Kudz Ze Kayah volcanogenic massive sulfide (VMS) deposits, Yukon."

## **NAPEG Digital Signature**

As of September 1, 2020, Digital Signatures have been available to NAPEG Professionals. Within the first ten days, there were 15 approvals. To date, there have been 36 approvals. Check the website for details on how to apply for your digital signature. Discount ends November 30, 2020.

#### What is a digital signature?

It is the affixing of a digital signature certificate that cryptographically secures an electronic file, thus proving the origin, the authenticity of the signer, and confirms the integrity of the signed document.

#### What is an electronic document?

An electronic document is a document carried by electronic, logical and visual media.

#### What is a digital signature certificate?

It is a computer artefact issued and cryptographically protected by a Certificate Authority (Notarius) attesting to the veracity of the information declared in the certificate. This information may include:

- Full name;
- Email address;
- Professional title;
- Membership number;
- Public key;
- Validity period and the serial number of their certificate.
